Following one of the recent Independent Member visits Flintshire Legal offered to prepare a summary of what is an interest for inclusion on your agenda. The suggested definition below is only a summary and is intended to act as a prompt for Councillors.

A personal interest arises where a matter under discussion, in respect of any business of your authority:

- 1. relates to or would affect one or more of the following within the area of the authority
- a. The Councillor's employment, employer, business or company
- b. Any land or contract held by the Councillor including contracts, licences or leases within the authority area
- c. Any club or society or other body of which the Councillor is a member or in a position of control
- 2. Would affect to a greater extent than other taxpayers in the Councillors ward/authority
- a. The financial position or well-being of:
 - i. The Councillor
 - ii. A person who lives with the Councillor
 - iii. A closely associated person (such as a member of the Councillor's immediate family or a close friend or associate)

A personal interest is also prejudicial where it is so significant that it is likely to affect the Councillor's judgement of the public interest, unless a specific exemption in the Code applies.

Matters raised by email -

Dropped curbs requested at the junction of Sealand Avenue with Brookside and Sandy Lane. Action – Wayne Jones will inspect.

The developers have built a path linking Farm Road to the new road to maintain access, path is brilliant, however where the path meets the new road, there are no dropped curbs at that junction. Can a very small fence be erected curb side to stop children running down the path and straight into the road, then an offset dropped curb to cross over Action – Wayne Jones will inspect.

Parking on pavements, mainly on the cycle path/pavements at Welsh Road when there is a football match on, also Sandy Lane at the junction with the cul-de-sac, vehicles park there entirely on the path (cars and light vans) maybe a few bollards could be installed to stop vehicles from getting on the pavement.

Action – Wayne Jones will refer to Enforcement.

The Clerk reminded Council that the agreed spend for the Chair's Fund for the 2022/23 financial year is £800.00. Payments being made under expenditure powers - Ancillary Power Local Government Act 1972 (S1). Of the allocation £400 has been paid out.

22/200 POLICE ISSUES

a) Community Speed Watch

Councillor Ashley Griffiths advised that additional speed checks will be arranged.

RESOLVED – that the report be noted.

22/201 FLINTSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL ISSUES.

a) Underpass - Foxes Lane

Wayne Jones advised on 13th December 2022 that a sweeper and gully emptier attended two weeks previously.

RESOLVED – that the report be noted.

b) Ferry Lane Footbridge – Noise Nuisance

Wayne Jones advised on 13th December 2022 and referenced previous emails sent to Council in particular Paul Edwards' email dated November 2021. I hope this helps as FCC need to find funding for the projects and there is no quick fix to stop the vibration noise unfortunately.

A response was sent to Wayne Jones on 14th December 2022 as pointed out by one of my Councillors this update basically means nothing has happened since November 2021 when FCC said that it will be investigating whether a grant can be applied for.

What Council needs to know is:

- 1) what investigations have been done since then as to what the criteria are
- 2) what is the process for applying and which other agencies/ bodies we / FCC should reach out to

RESOLVED – that Robin Nursaw be asked to advise on whether a grant application to improve the situation at the Ferry Lane footbridge has been submitted by Active Travel.

c) Dandy's Top Soil – Sealand Road

RESOLVED – Stef Connah Planning Officer – Enforcement be asked to provide a progress report.

d) Sealand Ditches

Following the October 2022 meeting Andy Roberts was requested to provide an update on the drainage issues in Sealand together with a report on the findings of the annual drainage inspection including the Garden City Drain that runs around the perimeter of Garden City. The Clerk and Chair have had separate conversations with Neil Parry in December 2022 who advised that he would submit an update to Council.

RESOLVED – that a reminder be sent to Neil Parry.

e) Concern about condition of side access – Spar Shop, Welsh Road

Stef Connah Planning Officer – Enforcement advised on 15th December 2023 that she contacted the developer in September 2022, in which their response was that they were planning on having the works complete by October 2022. They told me that they were liaising with a number of contractors for the works.

Stef advised that she discussed with her legal team who advised to give them the opportunity to get the works complete. Stef was told that the works have not been undertaken and she has forwarded to her legal team to purse, as a breach of a Section 106 agreement is a legal matter.

RESOLVED – that Stef Connah be asked for a progress report.

f) Trees – Sealand Primary School – Farm Road

The Acting Headteacher advised on 13th December 2022 that the work to remove the overhanging trees along Farm Road has been completed. The tree survey did not identify a need to reduce the height of the trees.

RESOLVED – that the report be noted.

g) Damaged fencing – Cycle Bridge – A494

Wayne Jones has previously advised that this has been referred to NEWTRA and SUSTRANS.

RESOLVED - that the report be noted.

h) Need for Traffic Calming Measures - West Green, Manor Road, Farm Road and Sealand Avenue.

On 13th December 2022 Lee Shone - Interim Transport Strategy Manager advised that instances of speeding for which are described can only be attributed to the refusal of motorists to abide by the legal speed limit. Instances of motorists travelling in excess of the mandatory speed limit is a criminal offence and would therefore be subject to enforcement action by North Wales Police. Lee will forward the concerns on to North Wales Police/Go safe for their attention.

Each request that comes into the Authority for Traffic Calming are assessed in accordance with Flintshire County Council Traffic Calming Policy. Flintshire County Council officers will now undertake an assessment of the outlined roads in accordance with the Policy and Lee will report the outcome of this work upon completion.

RESOLVED - that the report be noted.

i) Play Street – St Bartholomew's Court

Andy Farrow was asked whether Play Streets can be provided in Flintshire following the November 2022 meeting of Council.

RESOLVED – that a reminder be sent to Andy Farrow.

j) Sealand Road – A548 – Extend Street Lighting

On 27th November 2022 there was a fatal accident on Sealand Road in the early hours of the morning. This happened near the Texaco garage where there are no highway lights. County Councillor Chris Jones has raised her concerns about the lack of lighting at this location. The Community Council has in the past requested highway lights along the entire length of Sealand

Road. The County Councillor and Council have requested a full reassessment to provide street lighting. Darell jones has advised that he is waiting to receive details of the accident.

RESOLVED – that the report be noted.

k) Pot Holes – Foxes Lane and Manor Road

Wayne Jones advised on 13th December 2022 that works tickets are in for the potholes to be filled when resources become available.

RESOLVED – that the report be noted.

I) Brookside – Need to provide a bund fronting the Sealand Drain

m) Morriston Farm - Green Lane

The County Councillor advised on complaints she has received which have been referred to Stef Connah Planning Officer – Enforcement together with Public Protection, Cabinet Member Councillor Bithell.

22/202 <u>COUNCIL'S STREET LIGHTING</u>

All of the Council's 50 street lights are working.

At the October 2022 meeting it was resolved that Financial Regulations should be suspended with regards to securing three written estimates that should not apply with regards to the Council's required street lighting maintenance and adoption contract. The new contract is still awaited. For the 2023/24 financial year 9 lights identified by Dylan Williams for upgrading and replacement are concrete columns 129,131,135,136 and 166 at Cedar Avenue. And steel columns 157,160, 161 and 162 at Riverside Park. Cost per column to have replaced and adopted is £2,150. Total cost £19,350.00.

RESOLVED – that the report be noted.

22/203 SECTION 137 – LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1972 – PAYMENT OF GRANT

The appropriate sum for the S137 Expenditure Limit for the purpose of Section137 (4) (a) of the Local Government Act 1972 for the calculation of the Free Resource Base is based on the local population taken from the current electoral role. The Welsh Government have advised that the Section 137 Expenditure Limit for 2023/24 is £9.93 per elector. The electoral role from Flintshire County Council was 2538 at December 2022. So, per elector produces a total of £25,202.34

Allocated spend in 2022/23 is Section 137 grants of £3,000 and for school milk £1,500. Spend so far this year £1550.00 on grants.
