24/172 APOLOGIES FOR NON-ATTENDANCE

Apologies were received from Councillors Linda Thomas, Shelley Webber, Alex Lewis, and Jean Fairbrother.

RESOLVED – that the apologies be received and accepted.

24/173 IN-HOUSE TRAINING

Barbara Hinds (Chair) thanked all who attended last month's training and confirmed with Ashley Griffiths (Clerk) that another training session will be held in February 2025.

24/174 NOTICE UNDER LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1972 (Section 87 (2))

VACANCY FOR ONE COUNCILLOR

Ashley Griffiths (Clerk) advised that Flintshire County Council had informed him that no request for an election had been received within fourteen days of the original Notice date, and it is for the Council to fill the vacancy by co-option. Council is required to give public notice of co-option in accordance with Section 116 of the Local Government (Wales) Measure 2011.

The Council agreed to readvertise the public notice of co-option for the week commencing the 23rd day of September, which will be advertised until the 13th day of October per the recommendation of the Democratic Services department of Flintshire County Council. This was emailed to Council members, attached to the notice boards, and added to the Council's website.

RESOLVED – that the Clerk liaised with Flintshire County Council regarding readvertising the cooption notice and had clarification on how to proceed with a further readvertisement.

24/175 CODE OF CONDUCT DECLARATION

RESOLVED - that it should be noted that two declarations of interest during the meeting were made:-

24/176 MATTERS RAISED BY THE PUBLIC

Ashley Griffiths (Clerk) had not received a request to hold a hybrid meeting but proclaimed several residents would attend to discuss the ongoing issues with HGV vehicles damaging property and the lack of road signage informing HGV drivers on the correct route to their destinations.

RESOLVED – that Ashley Griffiths (Clerk) should inform the local government of Flintshire, local developers and Amazon of the ongoing issues in Garden City.

24/177 CHAIR'S REPORT AND ACTIONS SINCE 18th NOVEMBER 2024

Barbara Hinds (Chair) informed the Council about the regular monthly meeting between the Chair, Vice Chair, and Clerk. Unfortunately, the Vice Chair could not attend this time but was briefed on the agenda prior to the meeting for his input. RESOLVED—that the minutes of the Council meeting held on November 18th, 2024, be confirmed as a true and correct record.

24/179 CHAIR'S FUND 2024/25

Ashley Griffiths (Clerk) reminded the Council that the agreed spend for the Chair's Fund for the 2024/25 financial years is £800.00. Payments are being made under expenditure powers—Ancillary Power Local Government Act 1972 (S1). At the September, 16th 2024 meeting Minute Number 24/97, it was agreed that the Chair's Fund should cover the refreshments at St Bartholomew's Church for the Remembrance Service on Sunday, November 10th at 10:30 AM and the Christmas Concert on Wednesday, December 18th at 7:00 PM.

The Chair proposed that a payment of £50.00 from the Chairs Fund be approved for each of the following groups: Sealand Happy Group, Eye 2 Eye Social Group, 50 Plus Action Group (Flintshire), Flint Ladies Choir (who will be attending the Christmas Celebration event at St. Barts), Sealand C.P School, and St. Bartholomew's Community Hub.

24/180 POLICE ISSUES

a) Community Speed Watch

There was no report.

b) PCSO Aled Hughes – 3292

There was no report.

RESOLVED – that Ashley Griffiths (Clerk) will forward PCSO Aled Hughes, the Callender for all Council meetings, to allow him to attend another Council meeting at his earliest convenience and follow up on a previous email regarding damaged cars around Garden City caused by HGV vehicles.

24/181 MATTERS REFERRED TO FLINTSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

a) A-frame barrier amendment proposals

Christine Jones (County Councillor) reported to the Council that an amendment to remove the Aframe barriers has been passed, and a pilot project has started with police monitoring several areas after several barriers have been removed.

RESOLVED – that the report be noted.

b) Sealand Ditches

i) The Main River watercourse is adjacent to Dandy's.

Neil Parry, Flintshire County Council (Project Engineer), reported to the Council on July 4th, 2024, that Dandy's had removed the impediments.

RESOLVED – that the report be noted.

ii) The main river watercourse is located in England and crosses beneath Seahill Road.

Neil Parry, Flintshire County Council (Project Engineer), informed the Council on November 18th, 2024, that he would be attending several sites on November 21st, 2024, to reinvestigate the ongoing issues and will notify the Environment Agency to write to the landowners about removing impediments from within the main river watercourse.

RESOLVED – that Neil Parry will be requested to report to the Council on his last site visit.

iii) Banks Farm

Neil Parry, Flintshire County Council (Project Engineer), informed the Council on November 18th, 2024, that he would inspect the watercourse at one of the landowners' sites on November 21st, 2024.

RESOLVED – that Neil Parry should be asked for a report on the watercourse inspection.

c) Concern about the condition of side access – Spar Shop, Welsh Road

Glyn Jones, Flintshire County Council (Chief Officer, Planning, Environment, and Economy), reported on December 12, 2024, that he has met with colleagues in the Council's Legal Department to discuss

the courses of action which may be available to progress this matter and will report to Council in due course.

Cllr Christine Jones declared an interest regarding the condition of the side access to the Spar Shop.

RESOLVED— the Council will contact Glyn Jones (Chief Officer, Planning, Environment, and Economy) in January 2025 for further updates before the next Council meeting.

d) Sealand Road – A548 – Extend Street Lighting

Lee Shone, Flintshire County Council (Streetscene Officer), reported to the Council on November 18th, 2024, that he has put together a shortlist for funding for areas within the ward to the Welsh Government for extended street lighting. He informed the Council that this particular area has been added to the shortlist and clarified that the criteria for such street lighting consider road traffic incidents.

RESOLVED – that the report be noted.

e) River Dee Embankment – Coastal Path and Cycleway – Bluebridge to the Railway Bridge

Mike Taylor, Flintshire County Council (Senior Coastal Ranger), has previously advised that the repair cost is £200.00 per bench. The funding source is being investigated, possibly in collaboration with Wilson Auctions. The Council has agreed that the seat formerly situated between the two road bridges should replace one of the four existing seats, as mentioned above. Wayne Jones, Flintshire County Council (Streetscene Officer), has advised that he is waiting on Mike Taylor's regarding the funding.

Mike Taylor, Flintshire County Council (Senior Coastal Ranger), reported to the Council on 23rd October that he has been diverted to dockside improvements and will return to this issue after Christmas.

RESOLVED – that Mike Taylor (Senior Coastal Ranger) will be asked for an update on funding arrangements.

f) Problem with Trees- Orchard Way and North Green at Sealand Manor

Councillor Christine Jones addressed the Council regarding a fallen tree on Orchard Way and confirmed that Flintshire County Council has been notified about the incident. The Council is taking steps to address the issue, and Councillor Christine Jones will contact the housing officer to provide further updates on both sites.

RESOLVED— that Dawn Kent (Housing Manager) be asked for a further update from the housing officer regarding such matters.

g) Foxes Lane – Underpass - Water leakage and Graffiti

Wayne Jones, Flintshire County Council (Streetscene Officer), informed the Council on June 24th, 2024, that he would ask the North and Mid Wales Trunk Road Agent (NMWTRA) to inspect the underpass again.

RESOLVED— that Wayne Jones, Flintshire County Council (Streetscene Officer), be asked again for a site meeting with the Chair, Vice Chair, and Clerk to discuss the ongoing situation.

h) Garden City - HGV issues

Councillor Christine Jones updated the Council regarding safety measures on Farm Road, informing the Council that a temporary sign is being installed in response to concerns raised surrounding HGV vehicles. Furthermore, the temporary signage will be extended to provide immediate guidance to drivers, and more permanent signage will be discussed to ensure long-term safety is met.

RESOLVED— that Ashley Griffiths (Clerk) should inform Flintshire County Council, local developers and Amazon of the ongoing issues in Garden City.

24/182 COUNCIL'S STREET LIGHTING

Dylan Williams (Street Lighting Team Leader) has been asked to advise the Council on replacing the selected lights in the 2025-26 financial year.

All the current 33 street lights are working.

RESOLVED – that a site meeting with Dylan Willaims (Street Lighting Team Leader) should be organised to discuss the current street lighting in line with the Council's current street lighting strategy.

24/183 SECTION 137 – LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1972 – PAYMENT OF GRANTS

The appropriate sum for the S137 Expenditure Limit for the purpose of Section 137 (4) (a) of the Local Government Act 1972 for the calculation of the Free Resource Base is based on the local population taken from the current electoral role. The Welsh Government has advised that the Section 137 Expenditure Limit for 2024/25 is £10.81 per elector. The electoral roll from Flintshire County Council was 2538 in December 2022. So, per elector produces a total of £28,062.76.

The Allocated spend in 2024/25 is Section 137 grants of £3,035.00 and for school milk £0.00.ing

Spending in 2024/25 so far is £300.00.

A grant request has been received from Sealand C.P. School for funds to aid educational trips as part of the school curriculum. Up–to–date copies of bank statements have been provided.

RESOLVED – that in accordance with Section 137 of the Local Government Act 1971 that, the Council should award a grant of £1000 to Sealand C.P School, which is in the best interests of the area and its inhabitants.

Richard Roberts (Play Design Officer) advised the Council on November 18, 2024, that the Communications Board awarded to Sealand Community Council from Betsi Cadwaladr University

Health Board can be affixed onto the Welsh Road play area fence with a rough installation cost of approximately £180.00.

RESOLVED— that Ashley Griffiths (Clerk) will notify Richard Roberts (Play Design Officer) of the Council's decision to fund the installation of the communication board for the benefit of the children in the community it serves.

24/191 SEALAND MANOR PLAY AREA

Richard Robert (Play Design Officer) informed the Council on November 18, 2024, that the tyre swing at Sealand Manor play area is over 26 years old, uneconomic to continue to maintain, and requires replacement. The proposal is to provide a new tyre swing utilising the existing play bark surface; the cost to install this is £2000, making the total £8,315.00. Match funding for Sealand Community Council would be £4000 from the 2024/25 financial year.

RESOLVED— that Ashley Griffiths (Clerk) will notify Richard Roberts (Play Design Officer) of the Council's decision to match fund the replacement of the new tyre swing.

24/192 PLAY SCHEMES - 2025

24/195 LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICES PAY AGREEMENT 2024

The Local Government Association informed One Voice Wales that the National Joint Council for Local Government Services (NJC) has reached an agreement on rates of pay applicable from 1 April 2024 to 31 March 2025 and encourages employers to implement this pay award as soon as possible. Copies of the pay award details and salary scales were circulated to members of the Council on October 29, 2024.

Refer to Minute 21/80—Meeting 19th July 2021 – RESOLVED—that it be agreed that the Clerk should move to scale point 24 with effect from 1^{st} April 2022. Council also agreed under minute 21/80 that from effect from 1^{st} April 2022, the home allowance payment is £312. Noting that the internal auditor advised on the 22nd April 2021 that this amount is non-taxable.

RESOLVED – that the Council agreed to implement the pay award and backdate the retired clerk in line with the NJC agreement. Wainwright Accountants should be notified of this amendment to the payroll.

24/197 EXTERNAL AUDIT - ANNUAL FINANCIAL RETURN – 2023/24 FINANCIAL YEAR AND NOTICE OF AUDIT

Ashley Griffiths (Clerk) conveyed the council's external audit requirement, noting that the documents will be partly delivered to South Wales via recorded delivery and that the remainder will be uploaded to the objective portal. He also mentioned the public notice and details of the public inspection arrangements for the 2023/24 financial year, specifically that they are on the Council website and notice boards. Inspection runs from the 1st of July to 26 July between 10:00 and 17:00 on Monday to Friday in line with Section 30 of the Public Audit Wales Act 2004, which gives the elector the right to inspect the Council's accounts.

The Clerk advised that the completed Annual Return and most of the requested information were uploaded to the objective portal on July 10th, 2024, and 2 documents were posted via special delivery to Audit Wales on July 18th, 2024.

Publication of audited accounts for the year ended 31 March 2024

The accounting statements in the form of an annual return have been published on the Council's website. However, the accounts are published before the conclusion of the audit.

Several residents attended the Council meeting to discuss the ongoing issues with HGV vehicles damaging property in the Garden City area. They noted the lack of road signage informing HGV drivers of unsuitable routes.

RESOLVED: - that in the view of the special nature of the business to be transacted it is advisable in the public interest that the public is excluded.

24/201 FINANCIAL REPORT- 2024/25 AND 2025/26

The Clerk advised on the Financial Report as circulated: -

a) that a precept is an order to the charging authority – Flintshire County Council, to pay a requested sum to the precepting authority – Sealand Community Council, and that the schedule of payment from Flintshire County Council will be three equal instalments – on the last working days of April, August, and December.

b) the appropriate sum for the S137 Expenditure Limit for the purpose of Section 137 (4) (a) of the Local Government Act 1972 for the calculation of the Free Resource Base is based on the local population taken from the current electoral role. The Welsh Government advised that the Section 137 Expenditure Limit for 2024/25 was £10.81 per elector.

Welsh Government has advised that the Section 137 Expenditure Limit for 2025/26 is £11.10 per elector. Flintshire County Council confirmed the electorate as of the end of November 2024 was 2733. So, per elector produces a total of £30,336.30.

The allocated spend for 2024/25 for Section 137 grants is £3,035.00. Section 137 payments so far in the 2024/25 financial year are grant payments to Sealand Happy Group for £150.00, 50 Plus Action Group for £150.00, the Earl Haig Poppy Appeal for £200.00, and Eye 2 Eye Social Club for £150.00.

- c) The clerk is contracted for a 16-hour working week. Payment is net, with the Council deducting income tax at 20% on the full income and making payment to HMRC. The Council also pays the employer's National Insurance contribution to HMRC and the NEST Pension scheme, agreed under Minute 23/272. Wainwrights Accountants is undertaking payroll.
- d) Refer to Minute 21/80 meeting 19th July 2021 RESOLVED that it be agreed that the Clerk should move to scale point 24 with effect from 1st April 2022.

Council also agreed under minute 21/80 that the home allowance payment will be \pm 312 with effect from 1 April 2022, noting that the internal auditor advised on 22 April 2021 that this amount is non-taxable.

The NALC pay award 2023/24 has been advised on by the LGA via One Voice Wales and will be implemented on 1 April 2023. Copies of the pay award details and salary scales were circulated to members of the Council on 7 November 2023.

Based on the 16 hours worked in the contract, the salary for 2025/26, on a scale of 24, £33,024, will be £14,280.65. Plus, the home working allowance of £312 = £14,592.65.

The Council noted all the above at its meeting on 20 November 2023—minute ref 23/145 and the meeting held on 15 April 2024—minute ref 23/272.

- e) that IT expenses will be reimbursed by the Council.
- f) non-IT expenses incurred in carrying out his duties are also reimbursed. The expenditure is incurred on behalf of the Council as part of its administration and running costs, i.e., stamps and travelling expenses. NJC rate for Casual Users / HMRC approved mileage rate being paid for car mileage within Sealand and as required mileage to venues outside Sealand £0.45p per mile.
- g) The estimated income for the current 2024/25 financial year is £66,500.00, and the estimated expenditure is £68,125. The opening balance at 1 April 2024 was £55,951.88, including £25,000 contingency fund.

The estimated opening balance at 1 April 2025 is £57,594.94, assuming all planned expenditure occurs, which may not be the case.

h) the precept for the 2024/25 financial year is £64,000.00
